A one week residential research and field studies program based at the FAU Jupiter Campus providing opportunities for students to interact with scientists and education professionals involved in South Florida water systems. An environmental service learning program that consists of two semesters. This two-semester long program provides the opportunity for students to learn about local environmental issues and guides them through an educational process that facilitates the exploration of community problem-solving and civic engagement. - All persons, bags and vehicles may be subject to search
- Only clear bags are permitted inside the stadium, gym, and field areas All other bags, wristlets or purses, with exception of diaper bags for an infant or toddler, are prohibited
- No re-entry if you exit, you cannot return
- No admittance after the second half kickoff, 3rd quarter, or 5th inning
- No loitering outside of the stadium/school gates or in parking areas
