## PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

In the coming days, nearly 14,000 seniors will walk across stages to receive their diplomas in 28 separate ceremonies at the South Florida Fairgrounds. We are all so excited to celebrate each student's hard work and tenacity and to recognize the dedication of each person who played a role in helping ensure his/her success. As high schools celebrate their departing seniors, the School District works to address widened instructional gaps due to COVID-19 interruptions with enhanced summer programming. Please view the <u>Student Academic Support Plan (SASP)</u>, targeted at elementary, middle, and high school students to provide a boost to those students who have fallen behind or need additional support.

Throughout the month of May, we recognize the substantial achievements and contributions by the Jewish American, Asian American, and Pacific Islanders in our nation. Additionally, we continue to celebrate the history and culture of the Haitian community through a variety of <u>organized virtual events and activities</u> across Palm Beach County. Finally, May is <u>Mental Health Awareness and Trauma Informed Care Month</u>, dedicated to raising awareness, fighting stigma, providing support, and educating the public about the importance of mental health. The School District is committed to protecting our students' social and emotional health to enhance their learning and overall well-being.

## Secondary Progress Reports, Graduation, and Updates

- May 27, 2021: Quarter 4 Progress Reports will be available on SIS for parent viewing.
- <u>Class of 2021 Graduation Reminder:</u> The School District is pleased to offer in-person <u>graduation ceremonies</u> for the Class of 2021 following CDC guidelines and restrictions. Thank you in advance to our Senior Class students, parents, communities, and schools for making this tradition and celebration a huge success. - Facial Covering Updates for the Remainder of This Year: Facial coverings will remain mandatory in indoor spaces such as classrooms, hallways, and buses through June 18, 2021 which is the last day of the school for Grade 9 11 students. However, facial coverings are now optional for adults and students anytime outside, including, but not limited to sports, PE, and classroom transitions. Social distancing is not required for students while outside; however, good judgement should be used to keep students from close contact with one another to the best extent possible. School-based staff members are encouraged to incorporate outdoor 'mask breaks' with students when possible.
- Facial coverings will also be **mandatory** during next month's high school graduation ceremonies.
- Facial Coverings for 2021-2022: Facial coverings will be optional when students return to school campuses on August 10, 2021.



**COVID Reminder** - Students must not come to school, if ill and/or experiencing s symptoms including, but not limited to: fever, cough, sore throat, diarrhea, headache, body ache, shortness of breath, fatigue, loss of appetite, sense of smell, and other flu-like symptoms, or if someone in their household has tested positive for COVID-19.

Please note that you must check your AP Classroom for the assigned date, time, and location of each test – for example, if you declared that you would take a particular digital test at home, you cannot take that digital test on campus instead. If you do not complete the SET UP, you will not be able to take the exam on your scheduled exam day. Review this Presentation for more information.

If you need a Chromebook for an ON CAMPUS digital exam, you must contact Ms. Rawson to come on-campus to complete the SET UP for the borrowed Chromebook. If you are not planning to attend your ON CAMPUS exam, please complete this <u>G-Form</u> so we can adjust room assignments accordingly. If you completed the form, the changes are in motion.

Also, for AP Digital testing that starts this week, students MUST complete the EXAM READINESS procedures for an AP Digital test in order to test on their test day. It is the student's responsibility to download the CollegeBoard App (or find it on the Chromebook). Then, complete the exam "SET UP" within 3 days of the digital exam, on the device being used to take the exam. Do not switch devices!
